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### 2010 Loco Tempranillo Paso Robles

Alcohol: 15.0%

pH: 3.74

Total Acid: 0.59

Cases Produced: 238

#### Winemaker's Comments:

The Bull is Out! Its time to run with him. NO FEAR!!

**On the nose:** Rich leather and spicy tobacco layered with strawberries, encompassed by the subtle warm vanilla of French oak.

**On the palate:** Thick, powerful tannins ease into a luscious mouth feel, with flavors of concentrated red fruit, strawberries and dried figs. The fruit, long on the palate, is punctuated by leather and savory herb that trail into sultry caramel and spice. Think Leather & Lace, or more appropriate; Leather & Leather...

### 2010 Slayer 43% Cabernet Sauvignon 43% Petit Verdot 14% Syrah Paso Robles

Alcohol: 14.7%

pH: 3.61

Total Acid: 0.62

Cases Produced: 259

#### Winemaker's Comments:

I have been slowly introducing Cabernet Sauvignon into Slayer. I first had to find the right Cabernet vineyard and after sampling a few sites, I settled on the amazing Santa Margarita Ranch. This year Slayer is massive, but still sexy and seductive. Bring your Broad sword and lop some heads.....

**One the nose:** Blackberry and raspberry run deep into rich notes of toasted cedar, with hints of rosemary and sage.

**On the palate:** Black current and cherry, with long, lingering tannins that turns into a velvet mouth feel. The complex structure encapsulates rich blackberry fruit that finishes with sexy toasted oak laced with vanilla crème brûlée.



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### 2011 Grenache, "Drop Dead Legs" Paso Robles

Alcohol: 15.1%  
pH: 3.81  
Total Acid: 0.67  
Cases Produced: 555

#### Winemaker's Comments:

In the past I have talked about the origins of Grenache, its winemaking and how it fits into the grand scheme of wine... This time I'm going straight to the point! Grenache is Sexy.... Bright, luscious fruit that stands right up and says "Hello". Gorgeous body, firm but graceful, seductive and playful... Grenache inspires me.

Let me introduce you to "Drop Dead Legs". This is a special blend of two vineyards: Seven Oxen Vineyard and the Kiler Canyon Vineyard. Seven Oxen is old school head pruned, Kiler Canyon is cutting edge high density planting pushing the extremes of grape growing. This wine will seduce you... probably take you down.... And this one is going to hurt... blissfully.

**On the nose:** Bright violet and lavender with black stone fruit and spice.

**On the palate:** Black and red stone fruit turning bright with a hint of provençal herb, black cherry and laced with pepper and spice. Lively acid keeps the fruit bright and right up front with firm structure and mouthfeel dancing across the mid-palate. The flavors linger into a slow silky oak finish... it makes me think of lingerie.

### 2009 Peasant 48% Mourvedre 28% Grenache 24% Syrah Paso Robles

Alcohol: 14.9%  
pH: 3.68  
Total Acid: 0.69  
Cases Produced: 1557

#### Winemaker's Comments:

Right about now Soul Brother, the 2009 Peasant is all about the funk! Funk to me is the tragic Hero, the twist in the plot, the dark and brooding corner that scares you. It's what makes life interesting...from the pungent smell of French Cheese in all its

stinky glory to the complex gaminess of Lamb. If this turns you on then the 2009 Peasant is the soundtrack to your life.

Why? This year the Peasant is dominated by my favorite grape, Mourvedre. Grenache and Syrah have their roles but are mostly "pretty". Mourvedre is not pretty. It's cool... James Brown cool..., French Bete Noir cool....and makes no apologies. Dig the Funk.

**On The nose:** Spicy black cherry fruit flirting with provençal herb and brought to life by a vibrant acidity that keeps this story alive and makes the fruit dance with long, graceful mouth feel.

**On the Palate:** The complex fruit laced with subtle tannins trail into a sexy finish of cedar, nutmeg, and caramel. This wine is why man domesticated Lamb....
